Copying for purposes other than research

There is a difference between copying for an allowable fair dealing purpose

- research,
- private study,
- criticism,
- review and
- news reporting)

and copying for other purposes.

Putting a copyright protected work on a website or including it in a book likely cannot be considered to be research copying in most circumstances. Nor can these activities usually be considered to be private study, criticism, review or news reporting. Activities which are not fair dealing remain governed by normal copyright rules requiring permission from the copyright owner. This is the case whether the work is published or unpublished.
